Leaf Collection

LEAVES MAY NOT BE PLACED OUT FOR REFUSE COLLECTION OCTOBER THROUGH DECEMBER.

Leaf collection on all dedicated roads and streets is scheduled to start the second week of October and continue for nine weeks or until the first significant snow fall. Leaves should be placed in the gutter for collection. Leaves should not be placed out in bags or containers. Leaves in bags or containers will not be picked up at this time. The leaf collection crew will work through the Township on a continuing basis without a published day and area schedule. Leaves may be placed in regular refuse containers January through September. Township residents are encouraged to mulch or compost leaves at their residences if possible. Leaf piles that contain large general yard debris cannot be picked up by leaf vacuums.

Christmas Tree Drop Off

Residents can drop Christmas trees at "Tree Drop" signs located at the Warren Recreation Parking Lot, Gouglersville and Grill Fire Stations, the Montrose Manor Playground, the Penwyn Playground (lower level parking lot on Wyomissing Avenue), Augusta Lane in Flying Hills, the rear of Giant, on Harding Avenue, between Tioga Avenue and Bradford Avenue. Look for the signs. Trees may be dropped off at these points until January 31, 2025. Wood chips resulting from the trees are available to residents of the Township on first call basis. For further information, contact the Township Office.

Yard Waste Site News

Because of Western Berks Landfill's impending closure, Cumru Township was forced to move its yard waste site from the south side of Poplar Neck Rd. to the northwest side of Poplar Neck Rd. in 2024. Signage is now provided to direct residents to the new drop off area. Thank you to Cumru residents for their patience and cooperation with this change.

MS4 PROGRAM

Cumru Township is required to participate in the PA Municipal Separate Storm Sewer System (MS4) program. A part of Cumru's program is to maintain membership in several local organizations advocating for and working towards improving water quality in area streams, which ultimately improves drinking water quality for many communities. Cumru Township is part of the Wyomissing Creek Watershed Coalition, a multi-municipal cooperative effort to address major sources of sediment pollution in the Wyomissing Creek. The WCWC is designing projects throughout the watershed to reduce erosion in the stream corridor and participates in public education activities about the impact of stormwater runoff in the watershed, in cooperation with the Berks County MS4 Steering Committee. Cumru Township also contributes to public education and stream clean-up activities by the Angelica Creek Watershed Association, in association with Berks Nature.

YARD WASTE DROP OFF SITE - SEE NEWS ON SIDE PANEL

January-March, 2nd Saturday, 10 A.M. to 12 Noon April-October, 2nd and 4th Saturdays, 9 A.M. to 1 P.M. November and December, 2nd Saturday, 10 A.M. to 12 Noon

Note: Curbside yard waste collection takes place on a rotating Saturday in April and October for each refuse collection district. Please see the 2025 Refuse Collection Schedule for specific dates and requirements.

Location: Poplar Neck Road

Please watch Cumru Township website for any schedule changes.

The following items will be accepted: Leaves, Garden Debris, Brush and Bushes, Tree Trimmings, Weeds, Flowers and Garden Plants.

The following items will NOT be accepted: No Commercial Vehicles, No Stumps, No Grass, No Plastic Bags, No Root Balls, No Treated or Painted Wood, No Railroad Ties, No Tree Branches larger than 5 feet long and 6 inches in diameter, NO GLASS OR TRASH Kraft Paper Bags must be emptied.

Fines of up to \$300 will be issued for illegal dumping. Open ONLY to residents of Cumru Township, identification will be required! No commercial vehicles are allowed. The site will be patrolled by police and is under video surveillance. Cumru Township reserves the right to modify the list of items taken at the yard waste site.

Trash/Refuse Collection

Collection shall be once a week for normal, everyday household refuse. No construction waste. Please refer to the attached "Trash Schedule" and color code to determine the collection days for your household. NO HOT ASHES.

Approved refuse containers include 33 gallon cans with handles or tied polyethylene bags, or equivalent, which are designed especially for storage and collection purposes. Refuse containers shall not weight more than 50 pounds each when filled. It is understood that all refuse must be in such containers or securely tied in bundles, in which case a bundle will be considered a container as far as maximum weight is concerned, and no bundle shall exceed 3 feet in length or 18 inches in diameter. Containers are to be provided by the property owners. Each collection is limited to six bags or cans and one (1) bulk item. See other side for bulk item restrictions.

Brush/Yard Waste 2025

There will be curbside "brush/yard waste" pickups during 2025. The schedule is as follows: If your trash day is Monday: pickup will be Sat., April 5, 2025, and Sat., October 4, 2025 If you trash day is Tuesday: pickup will be Sat., April 12, 2025, and Sat., October 11, 2025 If your trash day is Wednesday: pickup will be Sat., April 19, 2025, and Sat., October 18, 2025 If your trash day is Thursday or Friday: pickup will be Sat., April 26, 2025, and Sat., October 25, 2025

Please Note:

- 1. All brush/yard waste must be set out the night prior to collection. There will be no re-run routes.
- 2. All brush/yard waste is to be in kraft bags (biodegradable bags) or tied securely with a rope of twine not to exceed two (2) feet in diameter, and three (3) feet in length. No wood over four (4) inches in diameter will be taken because of possible damage to trucks. No bundles or bags weighing over forty (40) pounds.
- 3. The limit per household is 12 bags or bundles.
- 4. No firewood, stumps, dirt, or rocks will be taken as part of this collection.

Recycling Collection

Recycling collection shall continue to be every other week. Please refer to the attached "Recycling Schedule" and color code to determine the collection days for your household.

Note: Our recycling program is a single-stream program. This means all recycling materials can be mixed in the recycling container. Items to be placed in the blue and yellow recycling container include: clear, brown and green glass; aluminum, steel and bimetal cans; plastics marked 1 through 7. We will now accept corrugated cardboard and cereal boxes, (no waxed cardboard or boxes that came in direct contact with food, such as pizza boxes), no styrofoam, paper board, newspapers, magazines, and phone books. Please break down all boxes.

Holiday Rules

Trash and recycling collections shall not be made on the following holidays: New Year's Day, Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Thanksgiving, and Christmas. All services will be delayed one day if the holiday falls on or before your service day. Please follow the color-coded calendar.

BULK ITEM PICKUP

Residents may dispose of one (1) bulk item per week through curb side collection.

Please have your waste, recycling and one bulk item available for collection at the curb by 6:00 a.m. on your scheduled day. The hauler may pick up between 6:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m.

Accepted materials – appliances (NOTHING CONTAINING FREON), furniture, mattresses, box springs, plumbing fixtures such as toilets and sinks, three (3) four-foot rolls of carpet (tied).

Unacceptable materials – Electronic waste (computers, televisions, etc.), chemicals, stains, liquids, batteries, automobile parts, hazardous waste, tires, tires on rims, commercial and industrial waste, construction materials (drywall, brick, block, lumber, shingles, tiles, concrete, replaced windows, etc.).

Additional instructions – Items which are too heavy to be lifted into a truck by two people will not be accepted. Additional trash bags are NOT considered a bulk item.

GREEN – south of SR 724, east of SR 625, west of SR 10, including: Freemansville Rd., Mt. Penn Rd., Seven Springs, Hessian Pines, Quail Ridge, Angelica, Vineyards, Imperial Dr., Maple Grove Rd., Candy Rd., Fawn Dr., Stonehill, Hidden Pond

RED – south of SR 724, east of SR 10, including: Flying Hills, Valley Stream Rd., Ridgeway Rd., S. 9th Street

2025 Refuse and Sewer Fees

FEE FOR REFUSE AND RECYCLING SERVICE

In 2025, the fees for refuse/recycling removal are \$320.00 for a dwelling with two or more adult occupants and \$290.00 for a dwelling with a single adult occupant. The due date and time for payment of the fee with no late payment penalty will be 3/31/25, at 4:30 p.m. Late fees will be charged after that date and time. A 5% late payment penalty will be added to unpaid accounts after 3/31/25, at 4:30 p.m., through 5/30/25, at 4:30 p.m. A 10% late payment penalty, calculated from the base fee, will be added to unpaid accounts after 5/30/25, at 4:30 p.m., through 6/30/25, at 4:30 p.m. Any accounts unpaid after 6/30/25, at 4:30 p.m. will be referred to a collection agency. Fees for 2025 refuse/recycling and SMP will be billed on one postcard in January. Only full payment is accepted. Failure to receive a bill does not relieve the property owner of any charges, including penalty.

FEE FOR ON-LOT SEWAGE SYSTEMS MANAGEMENT PROGRAM (SMP)

In 2025, the SMP fee is \$55.00 for each property served by on-lot sewage disposal, except for properties that are subject to a special maintenance agreement (such as a small flow treatment system or holding tank). The due date and time for payment of the fee with no late payment penalty will be 3/31/25, at 4:30 p.m. Late fees will be charged after that date and time. A 5% late payment penalty will be added to unpaid accounts after 3/31/25, at 4:30 p.m., through 5/30/25, at 4:30 p.m. A 10% late payment penalty, calculated from the base fee, will be added to unpaid accounts after 5/30/25, at 4:30 p.m., through 6/30/25, at 4:30 p.m. Any accounts

unpaid after 6/30/25, at 4:30 p.m., will be referred to a collection agency. If an on-lot sewage disposal system is subject to a special maintenance agreement as described in section 9 of ordinance 740, the fees associated with that maintenance agreement will apply. Fees with respect to on-lot sewage system testing, design, permitting, construction observation, and appeals are addressed separately. Fees for 2025 refuse/recycling and SMP will be billed on one postcard in January. Only full payment is accepted. Failure to receive a bill does not relieve the property owner of any charges, including penalty.

FEES FOR SANITARY SEWER SERVICE

Sanitary sewer postcard bills are issued in February, May, August, and November with 30-day due dates in March, June, September, and December. For accounts on public water, the bills are based on readings from the servicing water companies for the prior quarter (plus any late fees, if applicable). The basic rate is \$145.00 for the first 7,500 gallons of water consumed and \$0.019333 per gallon for each gallon over 7,500 gallons consumed. Some public water accounts are read in cubic feet; Township staff

can assist with understanding gallon equivalences for those accounts. For accounts obtaining water from on-site wells, and not connected to a public water system, the flat basic rate per quarter is \$200.00. A 2.5% late payment penalty will be added to accounts unpaid after the respective quarter's due date. Delinquent accounts of \$1,000 or more, or unpaid for 120 days or more, will be referred to collections. Failure to receive a bill does not relieve the property owner of any charges, including penalty.

Regular business hours are Monday through Friday, 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.; closed weekends and holidays. Drop boxes are available (no cash). Credit card payments can be made by phone or in person (fee applies). Call 610 777 1343 for more information.
