## SIGN UP TO RECEIVE EMAIL NOTIFICATIONS

Over the past few years, the Township of Cumru has made it a priority to find better ways of reaching our residents with the information they need. This process started with a face lift of our website (cumrutownship.org) and a redesign of our biannual newsletter back in 2010. In 2011, we created a facebook page and have been encouraged by the reach of our posts. Since 2012, we have been packaging our Recreation Schedule with the Refuse and Recycling Calendars to maximize our mailings.

In 2014, we launched two new resources, ParksNFunFinder.org and our mass notification system. The first grew from a cooperative effort between the five municipalities in the Governor Mifflin School District (Cumru, Brecknock, Shillington, Kenhorst, Mohnton) and the Governor Mifflin School District. It was launched this past fall as the Governor Mifflin Parks N Fun Finder (parksnfunfinder.org). The Parks N Fun Finder is a comprehensive source of all of the area Park and Recreation facilities, providers, programs, and events. We look forward to this being a great resource moving forward. In addition to the Parks N Fund Finder, we have also added



the capability of generating mass email notifications to inform our residents about Park and Rec. Events, Administrative Advisories, Public Safety Advisories, and Public Works Advisories. ## DON'T FLUSH THE FLOSS

Many household cleaning products are labeled and marketed as "disposable" but should not be flushed down the toilet. Items include: **disinfecting wipes, baby wipes, mop refills, paper towels, towelettes, dental floss, etc.** 

These products don't dissolve. They clog pipes, causing expensive and time consuming repairs for homeowners. These products also clog public sewer pipes and pump station equipment, contributing to higher sewer rates. Save yourself and your sewer system from a pain in the drain, put wipes, rags and floss in the trash, not the toilet!

## TIPS FOR MAKING SEWER AND OTHER PAYMENTS

Cumru Township accepts cash, personal checks, and physical checks generated by on-line bill pay services. Cumru does not accept electronic funds transfers via ACH, debit cards, or credit cards.

- The consumer is responsible for monitoring the disbursement of funds from her/his account.
- The consumer is responsible for being aware of her/his bank's internal policies.
- The Township is not responsible for errors by on-line bill pay services.
- The Township assesses a fee of \$32.00 for deposited checks that are returned for insufficient funds. The consumer is then required to pay the fee and original bill in cash.

## HELP US MANAGE STORM WATER

What many people don't realize is how storm water collects debris, like yard waste and litter. Solid materials bundle together at storm drains and block the flow of rain into storm water pipes. This can result in localized flooding that could have been prevented. Solid materials that get through the storm water system flow directly into local creeks and rivers, often containing pollutants that are harmful to aquatic ecosystems. Like many other municipalities, Cumru Township is responsible for enforcing regulations to minimize yard waste, litter, and other debris in storm water. Accordingly, by Ordinance No. 658, as amended, Cumru Township prohibits the disposal of grass clippings and other material in streets, unless clippings are removed from streets by one hour after sunset on the day on which such clippings are deposited in the street. When it rains, everyone is downstream of someone.

## DO I NEED A PERMIT?

Permits are required to protect all people from the effects of the repairs, additions, or new construction which are in violation of codes and which could cause harm to life and property. Permits are also required to ensure that federally mandated building related requirements, such as energy conservation and accessibility, are complied with.

For spring, many people may be contemplating the purchase and installation of a shed, pole barn, garage, or home addition. Depending upon the type and size of project, permits may be needed. Looking forward to summer, many people may be contemplating the purchase and installation of a pool or pool-type structure. Any pool, spa, hot tub, or other similar structure that can hold more than 24 inches of water needs a building permit and a zoning permit.

Sometimes, it can be confusing as to whether or not a permit is needed. If you have a question about permits, or if you need one for your next project, please call a Building Inspector at 610 777 1343, between 8:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m.

#### SEWER RATE INCREASE

#### Why is the sewer rate increasing in 2015?

As has been widely reported, the City of Reading wastewater treatment plant at Fritz Island is mandated to perform certain upgrades. Some of those upgrades have already begun. Cumru Township sends 98% of its sanitary sewer effluent to Fritz Island. Sewer customers in all of the municipalities sending sewer effluent to Fritz Island, including Cumru Township, are responsible for a portion of the cost of these upgrades. Certain additional charges from the City of Reading will begin to increase over the next few years. Cumru Township's only source of income to pay these costs is the quarterly fee charged to its sewer customers.

Rather than imposing a sudden, steep increase in the sewer rate, Cumru Township endorsed a strategy in 2012 of gradually raising the sewer rate to pay for the estimated cost of Fritz Island upgrades and other charges by the City of Reading. Several municipalities have adopted this strategy, with a rate increase projected to be between 8% and 8.25% annually for 9 years. Each year, a certain amount of the sewer fund balance is designated for payment of the City charges described above. The sewer rate is reviewed each year as part of the annual budget preparation. This strategy was discussed at public meetings in 2012, 2013, and 2014.

The 2015 sewer rate increase will be 8.1% (rounded). A metered account will pay \$110.00 for a minimum charge on the first 7,500 gallons of water consumption and an unmetered (well) account will pay a flat rate of \$153.00 per equivalent dwelling unit, or EDU.

The Municipal Authority of Cumru, the advisory committee on sewer matters to the Board of Commissioners, is recommending a project in 2015 to meter the wells of those sanitary sewer customers with on lot water. After metering, those customers will be billed in the same way as customers on public water and many may experience a reduction in their sewer bills. More information on this project will be forthcoming as specifications are developed.

## **RESIDENT INFORMATION**

#### STREET LIGHTS:

If you experience a streetlight outage, call Met-Ed or PPL directly by using contact information on your electric bill. When trees block streetlights, the lights cannot be serviced. Property owners are responsible for having their trees trimmed so as not to interfere with streetlight maintenance.

#### TREE TRIMMING:

Trees and vegetation must be trimmed to provide at least seven and one half feet (7'-6") of clearance above sidewalks and at least fourteen (14') of clearance above streets (Ordinance No. 137). Low branches can damage vehicles, impede sidewalk travel, and block signs. Property owners are responsible for having their trees trimmed. New

trees shall be planted a minimum of 10 feet outside of the legal right of way of streets (Ordinance No. 690).

#### POTHOLES:

The Highway Department fills potholes all year round. Please call (610) 777-1343 to report potholes and a crew will be dispatched.

#### NO SEWER DEDUCTIONS:

For those sanitary sewer customers on public water, Cumru Township discontinued the practice of deductions for pool fill-ups or other water that does not go through the sanitary sewer system. Sewer consumption is based solely on water consumption, as required by ordinance.

#### SEWER VENTS:

Sewer vents and clean-outs are a critical part of every building's sanitary sewer lateral. They provide access for repair, maintenance and inspection of the sewer pipes that convey sewage from a building to the Township's sewer collection system. The sewer vents and clean-outs are owned by and the responsibility of the property owner. The area around the sewer vents and clean-outs must be kept clear of vegetation, landscaping, and other permanent structures.

#### SEWER BACK-UPS:




Residents are encouraged to call the Township before they contact a plumber in the event of a clogged sewer. At no charge, the Township will investigate the problem and advise the property owner on the results. If you experience a sewer backup, do not flush your toilet or use water until the cause of the problem has been determined. The Township recommends contacting the Sewer Department at (610) 777-1343 Monday through Friday 8a.m.-4:30p.m. or after hours at (610) 607-1815. The Township will check the sewer main and sewer lateral. If the clog is in the main or in the Township's Section of the lateral the Sewer Department will clear the blockage. If the clog is on the property owner's section of the lateral or the building trap, the Township will advise the property owner to contact a plumber. There is no charge for this service.

#### GOUGLERSVILLE RD PHASES 3 & 4:

As many area residents know, Gouglersville Road is a significant collector road, providing a transportation corridor between Cumru and Brecknock Townships. In 2013, Cumru Township embarked on a 5 phase reconstruction of Gouglersville Road. Part of the reconstruction project has involved the installation and upgrade of storm water facilities, to lengthen the lifespan of the new roadway.



The Board of Commissioners gratefully acknowledges the cooperation of all those who use Gouglersville Road, especially the residents in the Gouglersville area, during phases 1 and 2 of the reconstruction project. The entire project was originally intended to be accomplished by reconstructing one section per year from 2013 through 2017. However, in order to shorten the inconvenience to local residents by a year, the Board of Commissioners has authorized both phases 3 and 4 to be completed in 2015. Completing two phases in one year will also be more cost effective, with projected savings of \$60,000.



The area to be reconstructed in 2015 runs from approximately 1,500 feet north of Beavens Road to the PennDOT right of way at Mohn's Hill Road. The 2015 detour, depicted above, will be the same as in previous phases. Construction is anticipated to begin in June.

## HOLIDAY TRASH/RECYCLING COLLECTION

Trash and recycling collections shall not be made on the following holidays: New Year's Day, Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day, and Christmas Day. When a holiday falls on a Monday or a Tuesday, collection shall be made on the prior Saturday. When a holiday falls on a Wednesday, Thurday or Friday, collection shall be made on the following Saturday. These changes are reflected in the trash and recycling schedules. Residents are encouraged to to place their items curbside on Friday evening.

#### **CURBSIDE BRUSH/YARDWASTE COLLECTION**

There will be two curbside "brush and yard waste" pickups during 2015. The collection schedule is as follows:

If your trash day is Mon: pickup will be Sat., April 4, 2015 and Sat., Oct. 3, 2015 If your trash day is Tues: pickup will be Sat., April 11, 2015 and Sat., Oct. 10, 2015 If your trash day is Wed: pickup will be Sat., April 18, 2015 and Sat., Oct. 17, 2015 If your trash day is Thurs or Fri: pickup will be Sat., April 25, 2015 and Sat., Oct. 24, 2015

Please Note:

1. All brush/yard waste must be set out the night prior to collection. There will be no re-run routes. 2. All brush/yard waste is to be in kraft bags (biodegradable bags) or tied securely with rope or twine not to exceed two (2) feet in diameter, and three (3) feet in length. No wood over four (4) inches in diameter will be taken because of possible damage to trucks. No bundles or bags weighing over forty (40) pounds.

3. The limit per household is 12 bags or bundles.

4. No firewood, stumps, dirt, or rocks will be taken as part of this collection.

## YARD WASTE FACILITY

Open <u>ONLY</u> on the Second Saturday of the Month, Yard waste will not be accepted on any other day. <u>Normal Hours of Operation</u> are 9:00 a.m.-1:00 p.m, <u>Winter Hours</u>







(Dec-March) are: 10:00 a.m.-12:00 p.m. The Facility is located off of Poplar Neck Rd.

The following items will be accepted: -Leaves -Garden Debris

- -Brush and Bushes
- -Tree Trimmings
- -Weeds
- -Flowers and Garden Plants
- -Kraft Paper Bags

The following items will NOT be accepted: -Stumps and/or stump grindings -Grass

- -Plastic Bags
- -Root Balls
- -Treated or Painted Wood
- -Railroad Ties
- -Tree Branches (larger than 5ft long & 6in wide)
- -Glass
- -Trash
- -Dirt or Sod
- -Concrete or Brick
- -Rocks

Fines up to \$300 will be issued for illegal dumping (Ordinance No. 676). Open ONLY to residents of Cumru. Identification will be required! No commercial vehicles are allowed. The site will be patrolled by police and is under video surveillance.

\*In order to comply with PaDEP regulations, items proposed to be dropped off at the yard waste facility may be declined at the Township's discretion.

## **PROJECT CHILDSAFE**

The Cumru Township Police Department has partnered with Project ChildSafe, a nationwide firearms safety education program, to distribute firearms safety kits, which include a free gun lock, to our residents. Project ChildSafe, a program developed by the National Shooting sports Foundation (NSSF), has distributed more than 36 million firearms safety kits throughout the nation since 2003. #### **BICYCLE REGISTRATION**

With warmer weather just around the corner, it'll soon be time for the kids to put their

sleds away and bring out their bicycles. The police department offers free bicycle registrations as a service to its residents. The registration process only takes a few minutes and consists of an officer obtaining a description, make, and model of the bicycle, as well as it's serial number. A permanent sticker with a unique registration number is then attached to its frame. This way, in case of theft or loss of the bicycle, the CTPD will have the pertinent information on file to complete a police report and initiate a search for it. ## **KID'S ID CARD PROGRAM**

The Police Department offers identification cards for children as a service to our community. These ID cards bear the child's name, photograph, a fingerprint, and physical descriptors. They are intended to be kept in a safe place by parents in case of an emergency that may require identification of the child. These cards can be made on an individual basis or in a group setting (Scouts, Day Care centers, etc.) and only take minutes to produce. ## **SNOW EMERGENCY ROUTES**

The Police Department enforces snow emergency routes; all vehicles must be removed from these routes. These routes are essential transportation corridors for the Township and must remain clear in order to allow Public Works snow removal crews to clear the roads.

Traffic signs identify streets that are snow emergency routes. When a snow emergency is declared, vehicles abandoned or parked on snow emergency routes may be towed and fined. Snow emergency routes are designated with signs and include, but are not limited to:

## "LEASH" LAW

It shall be unlawful for the owner or keeper of any dog to fail to keep at all times such dog either:

(1) confined within the premises of the owner;

(2) firmly secured by means of a collar and chain or other device so that it cannot stray beyond the premises on which it is secured; or,

(3) under the reasonable control of some person, or when engaged in lawful hunting, exhibition or field training.

All dogs must be under control. This means that when your dog is not on your property, it must be under reasonable control of you or a handler. The best way to control your dog is with a leash. Remember, dogs are personal property. You are responsible for any damage caused by your dog.

## FIRE DEPT - HOW TO GET INVOLVED

#### WHY VOLUNTEER?

Becoming a volunteer firefighter gives you a unique opportunity to serve your community while joining a select group of people few ever get to be a part of. Whether you choose to help out in a support role, become a fully qualified firefighter, rescue technician or apparatus operator, or pursue a path to becoming a fire officer, it requires hard work and commitment, but it can also be one of the most rewarding experiences you'll ever have. If you want to be part of a close-knit team, have a desire to learn and keep on learning, and want to help people when they need it the most, then the volunteer fire service just might be for you.



#### WHAT HAPPENS WHEN I VOLUNTEER?

If you're new to the fire service, you'll start off with an orientation period in which you'll be taught basic skills needed to safely help out during emergency responses. Over the first year or two, you'll participate in department activities and emergency responses, filling roles suited to your level of training and ability, and complete the State Fire Academy training that helps you become fully qualified as a firefighter or function in your chosen support role. If you've already spent some time in the fire service, your initial duties will be matched to your level of training and experience. Either way, where you go from there is largely up to you.

#### HOW TO JOIN
